

This week in assembly, we read the book 'Hey You' by Dapo Adeola together. We talked about the main ideas in the book and why the author thought it was important to write the book.




Children have been asked to 'step inside their story' to demonstrate that everyone's story is important and worth telling.

Key Stage 2






As well as learning facts about the history of Black British people, children have been asked to share their thoughts about what happened.

 If your child has been hospitalised due to asthma or allergies, carries an Epi-Pen Please ask their regular dentist about having it at the dental surgery

Top tips for good oral health:

- Brush your teeth twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste - spit don't rinse!
- Reduce the frequency and quantity of sugary foods and drinks.
- Visit your dentist regularly.

It is a pale-yellow gel applied to children's teeth using a small soft brush.

What is Fluoride Varnish?

The varnish sets quickly, has a pleasant taste and a fruity smell.

Specially trained dental nurses apply the varnish to children's teeth using a soft brush.

Why is Fluoride Varnish applied to teeth?

Fluoride varnish provides extra protection against tooth decay when used in addition to toothbrushing with fluoride toothpaste.






Attendance Matters

Supporting your child's attendance

Did you know your child can attend school with...

Toothache, Earache, Headache, sore throat, Conjunctivitis Glandular Fever, Head lice

Molluscum Contagiosum (viral skin condition)

Ringworm/Threadworm

Warts and Verrucae, Hand, Foot and Mouth

Cough/Cold – If your child has asthma, remember they may need their blue inhaler more often

If your child has been diagnosed with the following:

Chicken pox – Child can return to school 5 days from the onset of rash

Diarrhoea and vomiting – can return to school <u>48 hours</u> from the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting

Influenza (flu) – Children should return to school as soon as they have recovered

German Measles (Rubella) – Keep off of school for 6 days from onset of rash

Impetigo – Keep off of school until lesions are crusted/healed, or 48 hours after starting antibiotic treatment.

Measles – Keep child off of school for 4 days from the onset of rash

Mumps – Keep off of school for 5 days from onset of swollen glands

Scabies – Child can return after first treatment

Whooping cough – 5 days from starting antibiotic treatment, or 21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment has been given.

Doctors notes will be required for all of the above
