### **Message from Mrs Horton**

A letter was sent to families this week regarding Parent Consultations which will be happening in the week beginning 9th October. Once again there will be a range of times available for you to choose from, so please do take this opportunity to make the time to speak with your child's teacher. There will be plenty to talk about as teachers have spent a good deal of time getting to know the children and identifying priorities, which will be discussed with their Assistant Headteacher during Pupil Progress Meetings next week.

October is Black History Month and once again we will be marking it here at Hargrave Park. Key Stage 2 pupils will be learning about the people who were instrumental in making changes throughout Georgian and Victorian Britain to abolish slavery and challenge the ideas of Empire. Key Stage 1 pupils will be asked to 'Step inside their story' as a reminder that everyone's story is important and worth writing about. Children in Nursery and Reception will be exploring Black History through story books.

The month of October is not the only time we learn about and celebrate the stories, achievements and perspectives of black people around the world and throughout history. Our key driver of Equalities ensures that our termly themes are approached with an Equalities 'lens' at regular points throughout our two year curriculum map.

Our book corners are reviewed regularly to reflect 'who is in the room?' and ensure representation.

In staff training this week, we heard from Darren Chetty who explored the idea of how powerful stories are as a window into the lives of others and a mirror in which we see our own experiences reflected.

Black British children's authors Malorie Blackman and Joseph Coelho also provide inspiration at this link from the British Library.



Throughout October, classes will use the book 'Black and British' by David Olusoga to learn about people who played an important part in Black British History, in particular during the Georgian and Victorian times.




Who was Jonathan Strong?




Who were the three Kings who visited Britain in 1895?






Recommended for Years 3 & 4








# Attendance Matters

At Hargrave Park School we believe that good attendance is vital for children's:-

- learning and progress
- academic achievement
- mental health and wellbeing
- personal, social and emotional development

#### **Authorised absences**

Most absences for acceptable reasons will be authorized by the school:

- Illness
- Emergency medical or dental appointments
- A day of religious observance
- Exceptional family circumstance, such as hereavement

#### **Unauthorised absences**

Some of the following examples are reasons why the school may not authorize absence:

- Term time holiday
- Shopping/Day trips
- · Birthdays and other celebrations
- Tiredness
- Parental illness





## Supporting your child's attendance

## Did you know your child can attend school with...

Sore throat, Conjunctivitis Glandular Fever, Head lice Molluscum Contagiosum (viral skin condition) Ringworm/Threadworm Warts and Verrucae Cough/Cold – If your child has asthma, remember they may need their blue inhaler more often Hand, Foot and Mouth

Toothache, Earache, Headache

#### If your child has been diagnosed with the following:

**Chicken pox** – Child can return to school 5 days from the onset of rash **Diarrhoea and vomiting** – can return to school <u>48 hours</u> from the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting

Influenza (flu) - Children should return to school as soon as they have recovered

German Measles (Rubella) – Keep off of school for 6 days from onset of rash Impetigo – Keep off of school until lesions are crusted/healed, or 48 hours after starting antibiotic treatment.

Measles – Keep child off of school for 4 days from the onset of rash

Mumps – Keep off of school for 5 days from onset of swollen glands

Scables – Child can return after first treatment

Whooping cough – 5 days from starting antibiotic treatment, or 21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment has been given.

Doctors notes will be required for all of the above
