We are all confident learners, who are inspired by the world, flexible in our thi and understand how to care for oursel and others.



The School Day

We have a **'soft start'** at the beginning of the day. This means that children can go to their classrooms from 8.40.

During **'soft start'** the children can read, or complete independent 'early work', such as maths or spelling puzzles, or respond to artwork on the interactive whiteboard. It also provides an opportunity for children to look through their work from the previous day and have time to respond to the teacher's marking.

In line with best Early Years practice, children in the Foundation Stage have access to outdoor provision all day.

We have a flexi-break policy for all other classes. The class teacher judges the best time for the children to take a break during the morning session. We find that this is more conducive to maximizing learning opportunities. As each class goes out to play they collect their hamper, which provides a healthy mid-morning snack

Home time

Children in the Foundation Stage are collected from their classrooms, whilst children in years 1 to 6 are brought out to the playground and dismissed by their class teachers at 3.30pm.







This award acknowledges our high levels of pastoral care, our PSHE curriculum and the range of physical activity, PE and Sport that we offer. It also acknowledges the wider provision of the school across the extended day, including food and activities during breakfast club and after school club.



Lunches


School lunches are cooked on site daily by our caterers Caterlink. Caterlink is an award winning food service provider catering for many Primary Schools. Attendance

All absences must be reported by 8.30am each day.

Registers are taken at 9.00am sharp. Children who arrive after this time must collect a late card from the school office.

Vital learning is lost when late, and children can become distressed if you are late to pick them up

Holidays in term time

Hargrave Park operates in line with the local authority policy and does not authorise holidays within Term Time.

Holidays taken in term time are referred to the Education Welfare Officer who may issue Fixed Penalty Notices.Please note notices are per parent, per child.



Your child can attend school with...

Toothache Earache Headache Sore throat Conjunctivitis Glandular Fever Head lice Molluscum Contagiosum (viral skin condition) Ringworm Threadworm Warts and Verrucae Cough/Cold – If your child has asthma, remember they may need their blue inhaler more often Hand, Foot and Mouth

Supporting your child's attendance

If your child has been diagnosed with the following:

Chicken pox – Child can return to school 5 days from the onset of rash **Diarrhoea and vomiting** – can return to school 48 hours from the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting

Influenza (flu) – Children should return to school as soon as they have recovered German Measles (Rubella) – Keep off of school for 6 days from onset of rash Impetigo – Keep off of school until lesions are crusted/healed, or 48 hours after starting antibiotic treatment.

Measles – Keep child off of school for 4 days from the onset of rash **Mumps** – Keep off of school for 5 days from onset of swollen glands **Scabies** – Child can return after first treatment

Whooping cough – 5 days from starting antibiotic treatment, or 21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment has been given.

Doctors notes will be required for all of the above




Medication in School

Your child does not need to be kept at home, just because they are taking medication. If your child needs to take prescribed medication during the school day, please complete the medical consent form which can be found on the school app.

Please make sure that all contact details are up to date in case your child is not well enough to stay in school.

Bumped Heads

If your child has bumped their head, you will only be called if your child complains of feeling sick, dizziness and/or headache. A text/email will be sent to you informing you if they did bump their heads during the day.

We offer a FREE Breakfast Club to all children from Reception to Year 6. It starts at 8.00am and breakfast is available until 8.30am. Children are welcome to come at any time during this period.

After School Club

After School Clubs are available to all children from Reception to Year 6. Please contact <u>parents@hargravepark.islington.sch.uk</u> for information on how to book

At 3.30pm children go straight from class to the dining hall to sign themselves in. Once registered, the children are provided a hot or cold snack followed by free play until 4pm. Between 4pm and 5pm children attend the club they have been signed up to. Clubs finish at 5.00pm and collection is up to 5.30pm. After School Club+ is available for working parents until 6.00pm
