The language of letter formation!

Did you know we use set language to support letter formation? This week's letter is **A**.

A: down, lift, down, lift and across!

a: start at the top, go all the way round, up to the top, down and flick!

The school uses the Nelson Handwriting scheme from Oxford Owl. Take a look at the videos below for tips on practice at home and fine motor warm-up exercises. Encourage children to verbalise what they are doing to understand their thought processes as they write.



A message from our SENDCO: Miss D'Orsi

Did you know that there are a wide variety of Special Educational Needs – SEN?

SEN includes different types of barriers to learning. Children with SEN have differences in the way they learn and develop and may require different provision to be made to help them learn.

There are four broad areas of SEN:

- (1) Communication and Interaction
- (2) Cognition and Learning
- (3) Social Emotional Mental Health
- (4) Sensory and/or Physical Needs

In these broad categories there are a wide variety of SEN that children may experience.

At Hargrave Park we help all children to meet their learning needs and to reach their full potential.
