### A message from our SENDCO: Miss D'Orsi

### How can we help children to develop early language skills? We can use 'Adult-Child Interactions'

Adult-Child Interactions refers to ways in which adults can interact with children to support the development of language acquisition. These types of interactions may seem very simple, however, they have been found to be very important in helping children develop language skills. The more frequently these types of interactions occur, the more children are able to learn through these types of interactions.

What can we do in adult-child interactions?

• Sit face to face with the child – this shows you are interested and want to play; being face to face also helps with understanding and learning about non-verbal communication

**Examples of non-verbal communication:** eye gaze – looking at what is most interesting; facial expressions – showing surprise, excitement etc., body language – showing levels of interest, gesture – pointing to items

- Let the child choose the toy we all learn more when we are interested in an activity; offer your child a choice of 2 to 3 activities at least one of which you know they enjoy
- Share personal space get down to your child's level and share space with them
- Follow what the child wants to do with the toys children like to be able to experiment and explore, if you allow them to lead and you follow their ideas, they are more likely to engage in playing with you
- Wait for the child to start the interaction children with language difficulties may take a longer time to respond to what we are saying to them, give the child time to start the interaction, wait for their non-verbal or verbal communication
- Show you are listening by looking at them, copying what they say, adding to what they say and answering them
- Give your child time to respond to what you are saying children need time to process language as they are learning to match the words you are saying to an object or event, understand the meanings of the words, think of what they want to say next, find the right words and put the words in the right order, and put the right sounds in in each word
- Talk about what the child is doing describe aloud what they are doing as part of your interaction; as you do this you are providing the child with the right words to match whatever they are playing with and interested in
- · Don't ask too many questions instead turn your questions into comments
- Joint action interact together with joint physical actions
- Give specific praise by commenting on what the child has done praise is important in building self-esteem, building relationships and in enjoying activities. These simple techniques go far in helping children to develop language skills.

### Road safety and parking

We received a message from Mihaela Sonstrop, a Police Community Support Officer from Junction Safer Neighbourhood Team, regarding parents parking vehicles at the junction of Bredgar Road and Dartmouth Park Hill. She has asked us to share it with families:

We have been informed that the junction into Bredgar Road from Darmouth Park Hill is getting blocked by parked cars from parents picking up their children. This is a safety issue: there is reduced visibility for other car users, leading to a number of collisions; children are less visible to drivers.

Please park safely and considerately when collecting your child.

If you wish to discuss anything or raise any concerns, we are happy to listen and take action. You can:

- send the teacher a message on Tapestry or Seesaw
- speak to a member of staff in the playground in the morning or afternoon
- speak to the teacher at home time

If you would like to raise a concern at the end of the day, please talk to a member of the leadership team on the playground or wait for the teacher to dismiss all children safely.

If you have a concern about the behaviour of a child who is not your own, please speak to a member of staff about it. Do not approach other parents or other people's children directly.
