#### Floella Benjamin's story














She is a singer presenter, politician and author who was born in Trinidad, but moved to England when she was 10 years old.










We explored the life of Malorie Blackman. We discovered that as a child, when reading books, she could never relate to a character as they did not reflect her! Malorie started to write her very own stories with characters and plots loosely based on her own life experiences. After 2 years and 82 rejection letters she finally found someone who would publish her work.

We discussed the movement of Black people into Europe and focused on the language we use to describe people from different African or Caribbean countries. For example, Malorie Blackman is from Barbados and therefore, she is Bajan or Barbadian. We learned about Malorie Blackman's family journey to England and asked insighful questions. Later, we explored Malorie's book 'Nought and Crosses' and discussed how racism and injusctice made us feel.












The move together as a pace, as a pride, as a four,


