


I enjoy coming to school




I feel safe at school






Being in school

85% of pupils understand the school values – with 11% saying they neither agree nor disagree




If I find something difficult staff help me to understand

63% of pupils say that staff will help them to understand if they find something difficult – with 32% saying they neither agree nor disagree




Behaviour

96% of pupils understand what behaviours are expected of them in school – with 11% saying they neither agree nor disagree


48% of pupils say that children's behaviour is managed well in school – with 35% saying they neither agree nor disagree








This term we have had items on display from the 2012 Olympics and recently World War II, including a replica army uniform, an original fire warden helmet, ration book and even WWII tinned food! As well as many supporting books and posters which help to bring the topics to life.



Thank you to the pupils, parents/guardians who have searched out and returned the school's library books. We expect the children to look after and return the books weekly, in order to swap them for another exciting book they can enjoy.

We have embraced individuality and looked closer at some individuals who have dared to be different from an early age



One of the books we have read through together with inspiring individuals includes a scientist and Nobel prize winner, a women's rights activist in Saudia Arabia, a young boy who brought solar power to Sierra Leone, a skateboarder in Brazil, planning to be the first female skateboarder to win the Olympic gold.

Children's Occupational Therapy (OT) Drop-In Clinics at the Northern Health Centre









Wittington Health offers Children's Occupational Therapy (OT) drop-in clinics. The drop-in clinic provides parents and carers with the opportunity to speak with an OT about any concerns you may have regarding your child's development, sensory needs and selfhelp skills.

The sessions offered to parents and carers are for 20 minutes and are provided on a first come first serve basis. A referral is not needed to attend the OT drop-in clinic.

If you are interested in meeting face to face with an OT to talk about concerns regarding your child, telephone 0203 316 1892 to find out the dates of the next children's OT drop in clinic and to secure a slot. On the day of the clinic, make sure to arrive early to attend your slot and to avoid any disappointment.











The aim of the children's drop-in clinic is to offer advice and support to help parents and carers work with their child to achieve functional goals which include developing dressing skills, scissor skills, handwriting skills, cutlery skills etc








Attendance Matters

Did you know there are now 13 pupils who still have 100% attendance – that means they have attended school every day since September

There are also 97 pupils who have attendance between 96% and 99%

Best Class Attendance this week goes to...

They have achieved 95.8% attendance this week.

We have had 173 pupils arrive late for school since September!

The total number of minutes late or missed minutes of learning is now a staggering **27,960**

That is roughly 466 hours or equivalent to 72 school days!

R: Down, lift, and round till you stop, out from the middle, and down.


Practice at home!


