Once you have a library card you can also log onto the National Library 'Libby App' which allows you to read books for free online.










Attendance Matters

A huge congratulations to the 6 children who have achieved 100% attendance and 100% punctuality – This means they have never had a day off of school nor have they ever been late this academic year!

There are also **97** pupils who have attendance between 96% and 99% - A special "Well done" to all 97children

We have had **189** pupils arrive late for school since September!

The total number of minutes late or missed minutes of learning is now a staggering 35,495

Calm Corners, Coaches and Play Equipment


This year, with your help, we have been able to subsidise the cost of the coaches to Frinton-On-Sea, calm corners in the early years setting and breaktime play equipment.
