






Attendance Matters

Prepare the Night Before

Z: Start at the top. Go straight across, diagonally to the bottom, and across.


Practice at home!



them!














Anti bullying week is an important topic covered by all classes in the school. We have a range of books highlighting kindness, respect and inclusivity.






A simple story with fantastic illustrations by Chris Riddell




A gentle chimp fed up with being bullied




This unusual family get the whole neighbourhood spreading rumours. When the Jolley-Rogers leave, the town discovers they were wrong to assume the worst


Recommended for KS2
